- → Truth & Reconciliation assembly
 - ◆ Thank you to Ms. Lundrigan and Ms. Lui it was beautiful
 - Students came and played drums with the Coast Salish Nation
 - Ms. Lundrigan has discovered <u>2 Meitis Women</u> who are an Indigenous workshop facilitation agency who specialize in hands-on workshops that raise awareness of Indigenous culture.
 - Ms. Fong knows that there is a grant we can apply for that will allow us to get Loreli from 2 Metis Women in for a drum making workshop
 - Connection for our Indigenous students
 - First Nations students can play their cultural instruments

 - Once kids have settled & parents have met w teacher the school has class reviews
 - Learning support

 - This data helps

 - Issues:
 - BCTF disagrees with large scale assessments as a whole
 - Fraser Institute uses the data to rank schools which leads to:
 - Some schools being more 'desirable' creating issues with registrations and fraudulent address claims
 - Some schools being less 'desirable' with no further data
 - If kids don't do the test they are given a 0 so the more kids take the test the better the school ranks no matter what kind of other educational principals, clubs, equipment or support that they offer
 - It's up to parents to educate themselves about it and make a decision
